We have noticed a significant increase in sales of chilled goods and chilled meat over the last 18 months. As a result you might find we now have a better range. You can also order fresh meat from the shop and we will place the order with Else's of Stalbridge you buy at the same price as in their shop. Orders can be placed the day before for deliveries on Tuesdays or Fridays.

You can order fruit and vegetables by placing your order before 1 pm the day before you wish to collect.

Thank you to those who donate fresh fruit, vegetables, plants and flowers for the shop to sell. This helps deal with surplus produce, support the shop and extend the choice of fresh produce to other villagers. We shall soon have an outside stall to house additional produce which will hopefully keep the produce fresher for longer.

Post Office Services

Keeping our Post Office was felt to be very important and the application and refitting took a great deal of time and effort by several people. We are grateful to all those who worked so hard and to our customers for their continuing support.

The shop is paid a small amount for every transaction carried out. These small amounts build up and reduce the overall cost of running the Post Office so please use it.

Jackie runs the Post Office counter every day except Thursdays when Glynis is behind the counter. Liz and Carole help out occasionally when needed.

Now that so many bank branches are closing, it is good to know that you can carry out most banking transactions here in your shop. You can also top up your mobile phone or electricity key, pay bills, tax your vehicle, order foreign currency (we have Euros in stock) and do many other things including postage. The Multi Currency Travel Money Card is proving very useful for travellers - it saves you having to carry large amounts of currency or having to pay transaction charges if you use your credit or debit card abroad. The One4All gift cards are also popular - they can be spent in a very wide variety of high street stores.
