Post Office Services

Many of you will know that the Post Office is now run by an Outreach service. Normal Post Office services are available in the shop between 1.30 pm and 4.30 pm each Wednesday.

Additional Shop Services

The shop also offers a limited bill payment service, depending on who you provider is, during normal opening hours. This is provided by the Payzone network which in turn is owned by the Post Office. We hope therefore that more services will be provided via the Payzone terminal in due course. You can also get top-ups for your mobile.

Of course, the shop still sells postage stamps and can offer cash-back. However, we can only sell the stamps for cash unless you buy goods to cover the cost of paying by card. This also applies to cash-back because the provider charges us a commission on the value of the cash as well as that of the goods you buy.

Ice Creams and Cool Drinks

We have a great range of popular ice creams and chilled drinks. Just the job when you find the weather getting a little bit warm. Our patio is there for you to use - why not buy a cold drink or coffee and settle down for a chat with your friends. We have parasols which can be erected if you need some shade.
